

50 Year Club Created

Al Reed and Ed Shahady are working with the alumni council to further develop the 50 Year Club. The club will have its own set of bylaws and leadership. Initial goals of the club include an annual meeting and induction of new members at every 50th reunion, creation of senior scholars (alumni) who would volunteer their time to describe the value of a Jesuit education to their careers and life, and encourage the development of a legacy fund for each 50 year class. The class of 1964 has already started its legacy fund by pledging to raise \$250,000 for a scholarship by the time of their 50th anniversary. Representatives of the next few 50 year classes are currently developing the future guidelines for the club.

Class of 1964 Fundraising Story

In 2009, during their 45th reunion, the class of 1964 set a goal to raise \$250,000 by their 50th anniversary in 2014. One year into their efforts more than \$60,000 has been committed to the scholarship fund. However, class agents J.J. Lauer and Gene Julian are encouraging members to continue to make gifts and pledges to the fund. To date, 16 class members have made gifts to the Class of 1964 Ignatian Scholarship. Lauer and Julian said more help is needed in order for the class to reach its goal for its 50th reunion in four years.

Lauer said he hopes other classmates will support "this ambitious endeavor to the best of their financial ability." "Our class was blessed with an excellent Jesuit education, which

prepared us for life's journey in many ways. In addition to the specific academic disciplines we pursued during our four years, Wheeling Jesuit gave us a broad open-minded and worldview perspective," Lauer said. "The University instilled in each of us a sense of hard work and fair play, and it taught us to think logically and make ethical choices in life."

The scholarship is one way members of the class of 1964 can ensure that future generations have and experience the same wonderful opportunities his class received and enjoyed during the early years of Wheeling College . The Class of 1964 Ignatian Scholarship will provide future WJU students financial assistance to make attending WJU more affordable, Lauer added.

Class member and scholarship supporter John Aluise said, "At this time in my life, I now can share some time, talent and treasure for the benefit of the institution that had a significant influence upon my values and my professional growth. The commitment that the Class of 1964 made to establish a \$250,000 endowed scholarship will help enable Wheeling Jesuit to continue to shape the lives of young men and women. I strongly encourage my fellow alumni to return some of their time, talent and treasure to a most worthy cause.

Things to Think About When Planning Your 50th

50 Year Club Inaugurating Senior Scholars

The 50 year club is proposing the creation of a senior scholars program. This program will recruit senior alumni who have a sustained and distinguished career in their chosen field. These alumni (Senior Scholars) will be individuals that have been recognized by their professional organizations, and other significant institutions as leaders in their field.

Attributes that characterize a senior scholar will include community service, humanitarian effort, academic and scholarly accomplishment, corporate and business leadership, and other attributes that characterize a successful and distinguished career. The scholars will be asked to volunteer their time to help the University in several ways,

- (a) address high school classes and parent teacher organizations to share the value of a Jesuit education and encourage attendance at WJU,
- (b) address foundations and other grant giving agencies encouraging funding for WJU,
 - (c) return to campus and engage in class-room discussions about their field,
 - (d) other functions as deemed appropriate.

A committee of current and future members of the club and alumni office will be responsible for identifying and recruiting alumni as senior scholars. Nominations will be solicited from all alumni. The program is in the formative stage. Discussion is ongoing with other alumni and school officials. At the homecoming weekend Ed and John Egan McAteer met with WJU faculty member John Whitehead and Father Jim Fleming and other alumni to discuss the program.
