Underage purchase of alcohol or misrepresentation of age is subject to a fine up to \$500 and three days in jail or probation.

Purchase of alcohol for those underage is subject to a fine up to \$500 and up to 10 days in jail. Public intoxication is subject to a fine up to \$100 and up to 60 days in jail or completion of an alcohol education program or counseling. Driving under the influence of alcohol, or other drugs (includes DUI), depending on circumstances, is subject to incarceration 24 hours to 10 years, a fine of \$100 to \$5,000, and license suspension six months to life.

Controlled Substances

Under state law, conviction for possession of a controlled substance is subject to incarceration for up to six months and a fine up to \$1,000. Sentences can be double for second or subsequent offenses. Manufacture, possession, or delivery with the intent to manufacture or deliver a controlled substance is subject to, depending on the substance classification, up to 15 years imprisonment and/or a \$25,000 fine upon conviction. Sentences can be doubled for subsequent offenses and mandatory prison terms result for convictions involving distribution of controlled substances to minors or within 1,000 feet of the University or other school. Federal sanctions for illegal possession of a controlled substance vary with the conviction, substance possessed, and the quantity of the substance. First conviction is subject to up to one-year imprisonment and a fine of at least \$1,000 but no more than \$100,000 or both. After one prior drug convictions, the penalty is at least 15 days in prison, not to exceed two years and a fine of at least \$2,000 but no more than \$250,000 or both. After two or more prior drug convictions, the penalty is at least ninety days in prison, not to exceed three years, and fined at least \$5,000 but no more than \$250,000 or both. Those convicted of illegal possession of a controlled substance are also subject to denial of federal benefits, such as work-study, student loans, grants, contracts, and to loss of professional licenses and disqualification for a commercial driver's license, for up to one year for the first offense, for life for the second offense.
